EMERGING DIETETIC LEADER

Leslie Weidner, RDN



The Washington State Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics is proud to honor Leslie Weidner as the Emerging Dietetic Leader of 2022. The purpose of the annual EDL award is recognize the competence and activities of dietitians regardless of their age, who have made distinctive contributions early in their dietetics careers to the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics.

Leslie Weidner started her private practice in 2017, providing 1:1 nutrition counseling to individuals, as well as nutrition education and cooking classes to small groups in her local community. For the last few years, she's made it her mission to help women struggling with the physical and emotional changes of perimenopause and menopause through nutrition and lifestyle coaching. Leslie uses the principles of intuitive eating to help women improve their relationship with food

and their body, while teaching them how to make sustainable lifestyle and nutrition changes that supports their hormonal health. She also manages her own website, nutrition blog and monthly newsletter to support her clients, and leads online virtual nutrition workshops related to women's nutrition and hormonal health. States a letter of recommendation: "The work she does with women during what can be an overwhelming and frustrating time is so valuable to the community and to the profession. Her videos about the struggles of menopause and perimenopause help women understand that they are not alone and gives them a community of other women facing similar challenges, with a healthy dose of humor and some nutrition tips to help them in their journey. Her commitment to this community is commendable. "

Ms. Weidner has also served in many leadership positions, including serving on the board of the Greater Seattle Dietetics Association (GSDA) and the Nutrition Entrepreneur Dietetics Practice Group (NE DPG). Leslie has been the lead Nominating Committee member of GSDA for three years and has taken on the role of Membership Chair from 2021-2022, as she continues to grow her leadership in the organization. States a letter of recommendation: "She remains one of our longest running board members and her insight and contributions to the organization have been and continue to be invaluable." In addition to her work with the local district, she has also taken on the role of Social Media Chair for the Nutrition Entrepreneur Dietetic Practice Group (NE DPG) where she continues to grow as a leader and promote this wonderful DPG.

EXCELLENCE IN MANAGEMENT PRACTICE AWARD

Melissa Molloy, MS, RDN, CD

The purpose of the Practice Awards recognizes outstanding registered dietitian nutritionists; nutrition and dietetics technicians, registered; and members who have demonstrated innovation, creativity, and leadership in a specific area of practice.

Melissa earned a BS from Michigan State University and pursued a MS while interning at Eastern Illinois University. After completion, Melissa moved to Indiana in 2014. Here she worked as a Clinical Nutrition Manager at Ortholndy, providing nutrition care for inpatients and outpatients,

training food service staff, and supporting other local area hospitals through audits and training.

Melissa relocated to Washington in 2017, branching out from food service and management into outpatient nutrition counseling working for ATI Physical Therapy for 2 years. There she helped clients with a range of nutrition-related needs including food allergy management, weight management, blood sugar control, and heart-health measure improvements.

Melissa currently works for UW Valley Medical Center in the role of Manager of Clinical Nutrition & Patient Services serving the southside of the Greater Seattle area. In this role she has collaborated with other disciplines to improve tighter glucose control for patients and presented to WSHA on outcomes, increased dietitian FTEs to better match increased complexity of patients, and improved patient tray delivery services by decreasing the number of late trays and increasing patient satisfaction. She has been awarded both Silver Star of the Year and Gold Star for continuous improvement efforts for her work supporting nutrition services.

Melissa is a member of the Quality Management Committee for the Academy and is current Secretary of the Washington State Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics.
